WELCOME TO BURTON WHERE HISTORY LIVES!

Burton remains a quiet rural community with a town square patterned after the village greens of New England. In 1798, Burton became the **first** settlement, and the **first** official township in the county, and our historic district is known for its fine examples of Western Reserve architecture.

In 1877, Burton was the home of Ohio's **first** telephone line. You will find a historic marker outside the Burton Chamber of Commerce Log Cabin which commemorates the event.

Located in Geauga County, home of the 4th largest Amish community in the world, Burton is rich in history and culture and is the backdrop for a variety of wonderful events throughout the year.

FROM AMERICA'S BIRTH TO OUR FOUNDING 1798 PIONEERS SETTLED A NEW NATION

PIONEERS & VISIONARIES

Merely 22 years after our nation was founded, brave explorers ventured into the Northwest Territory.

Their determination and entrepreneurial spirit laid the foundation for the community we enjoy today.

JUNE 21, 1798

In June of 1798, the Umberfield family arrived, creating the **first permanent settlement** in what would later become Geauga County. Using an ox cart to carry their belongings, Thomas and Lydia Umberfield migrated from Connecticut with their children.

In less than a month, the family had established themselves in a new cabin near a natural spring west of today's Burton Square. (A plaque marking the location can be found at the bottom of Spring St.)



Although it was simply a one room house, building it was no small task without the use of the power tools we have today.

Thomas cut down the trees by hand to build his walls and roof and provide his family with somewhere to live.

Everything from the floor to the roof needed to be made with just the tools and supplies available. However, the Umberfield's were not so different from us today: after a hard day's work, it is likely Thomas and his family appreciated the comfort of their bed and their mattress made of leaves!

SETTLING IN

During the first decade of the Burton settlement, small groups of Native Americans traveled the trails along the Cuyahoga River and established temporary camps near what is now Memorial Cemetery. They were said to spend summers in the Sandusky area planting corn and beans and fishing, then return to the Cuyahoga region during the winter to hunt and trap.

These Native Americans played a vital role in the survival of the early settlers, helping to feed them during the winter of 1798–1799 and teaching them how to tap maple trees and process sap into sugar. This practice became a lasting tradition—one that has continued and evolved over generations and remains an integral part of life in Burton. ■

Our Historic District

More families soon joined the Burton settlement. The homes & public buildings they built are still a vibrant part of the fabric of Burton.

The Burton Historic District is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and covers roughly 20 acres around the village green.



1811 – Dr. Erastus Goodwin moved to Burton, becoming one of the first doctors in town. He served as an army surgeon in the War of 1812. In 1815 he build his brick home. Today it is operated as a **B&B**.

1834 – The Hickox “Brick”, located at the south end of Burton’s green, was built by Eleazar Hickox who arrived in in 1804 and established himself as a trader, driving cattle herds east and returning with goods for sale. The Hickox House has served as the *home of the Geauga County Historical Society* since 1941.



1891 – George Ford, son of Ohio governor Seabury Ford, built the beautiful Queen Anne home on the east side of Burton’s village green. Famous visitors to the home included James A. Garfield, William McKinley and Marcus Hanna.

Today it is the home of **Quintealia’s Tea Parlor**. The gazebo on the south end of the building is home to **Kaleidoscope Artisans Guild**, and on the second floor in the main house above the Tea Parlor you will find **Inspired Home Decor**. ■

In the century following the revolutionary war, the village expanded and the growing business community eagerly welcomed the advancements in technology bringing the newest trends in goods and services to their customers.

Nov. 23, 1877

The **first** telephone line installed in Ohio was located in Burton, stretching from the train depot at Burton Station to the Boughton Ford Bank.

1887 – The Boughton Ford Bank building was built at the north end, west side of the commercial district and is now part of the Burton Village Historic District on the National Register of Historic Places.



1884 – Geauga County Agricultural Society purchased the land that is now the Great Geauga County Fairgrounds. 1889 The Domestic Arts Bldg was built, 1890 the Flower Hall was built.

FEB. 21, 1900

The Cleveland & Eastern Interurban Railway carried its first passengers on the Burton-Middlefield Line. ■





MEMORIAL CEMETERY, BURTON OHIO

14 INDIVIDUALS WHO SERVED IN THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR ARE LAID TO REST IN MEMORIAL CEMETERY. THESE VETERANS WERE GIVEN GOVERNMENT MARKERS. THE MARKERS WERE DEDICATED ON MAY 30, 1987 BY THE SAMUEL HUNTINGTON CHAPTER, SAR.



Mathias Fox – Born 1763. Private. Died 1846. A row of seven obelisks for the Fox family stands at the entrance of the cemetery (sometimes referred to as Fox cemetery), reflecting the family's long history in the area.

James Goff – Born 1762. Sergeant. His official discharge signed by George Washington on June 10, 1783, at New Windsor, which cited his "seven years good and faithful service". Died 1849.

Seth Hayes – Born in Russell, Mass. Served as a Private. Seth, his wife, and three of their children died in an epidemic during the winter of 1815 on Dec.25th.

Lebbeus Herrick – Served as a Private for 3 yrs. Died Oct. 1821.

Moses Hutchins – Born in 1756. Served as a Private. Died in 1834.

Benjamin Johnson – Born in 1761. Served as a Captain. He died in 1828.

Nathan Parks – Born May 6, 1758. Served as a Private. Died Aug. 10, 1832. He was then seventy-four and a resident of Burton "for the space of thirty years past."

Amos Beard – Born April 2, 1745. Served as a Private for 13 days. Died Aug. 7, 1821.

David Brooks, – Born May 2, 1761 Served as a Private. Died 1821.

Marimon Cook – Born Nov. 12, 1761, Died Aug. 25, 1858. Served in the Connecticut militia (often listed as "Cook" or in caring for the sick).

David Dayton – Born July 23, 1749. Served as a Private. Died Nov. 14, 1828.

Andrew Durant – Buried in Memorial Cemetery, Burton Ohio. A marker was dedicated in 1987

John Ford – Born Oct. 19, 1763. Served as a Private. Died on Aug. 6, 1842.

Caleb Fowler – Born Dec 31, 1755. Served as a Private. Died Oct 12, 1822.

Pancake Town USA



THE TRADITION OF INDULGING IN PANCAKES BEFORE EASTER TRACES ITS ORIGINS BACK TO AROUND 600 A.D. IN EUROPE. THIS PRACTICE EMERGED AS A WAY TO UTILIZE RICH INGREDIENTS - EGGS, MILK, AND SUGAR - BEFORE THE FASTING OF LENT BEGAN.

The word "**pancake**" appeared in English in the 15th century, meaning a cake cooked in a pan rather than baked in an oven. As settlers moved to the American colonies, they adapted European recipes using local ingredients. In the 19th century, the thick, fluffy **American Pancake** emerged with the introduction of leaveners like baking soda in the 1840s and baking powder in the 1850s, allowing pancakes to rise without yeast and distinguishing them from European versions.

A Uniquely American Breakfast

Long before *American* pancakes became a breakfast staple Native Americans discovered the sweet bounty of maple trees, learning to gather the sap in the early spring. They perfected techniques to tap the trees and boil sap into syrup or crystalized maple sugar, which was highly valued as one of the few locally available sweeteners that could be stored and traded.

In the 17th & 18th centuries, British colonists learned the art of maple sugaring from their



Native American neighbors. This practice gained popularity as it offered a more affordable and accessible alternative to imported cane sugar.

The combination of Native American maple knowledge, European pancake traditions,

and the geography of North America transformed a seasonal forest product into an essential ingredient for a **uniquely American breakfast tradition.**

In 2026, for the **95th season** volunteers will once again tap trees, boil sap and make syrup at the Log Cabin on the square.

The "**American Pancake**" also holds a special place in Burton. For **76 years** visitors from all over the country have come to Burton each spring for All-You-Can-Eat pancake breakfasts every Sunday in March. You can count on your pancakes being served with locally made real Maple Syrup.

Over the years the popularity lead to Burton being officially named as **Pancake Town USA.** Make this season the start of your new annual **American breakfast** tradition in Burton. ■

Curt Johnson has been gathering sap in and around Burton for the Burton Chamber of Commerce Log Cabin & Sugar Camp since the 1950s, back when he was a student at Burton High School. Maple sugaring has always been a family tradition. His father, Ture Johnson – one of the first inductees into the Maple Hall of Fame – served on the Geauga County Maple Festival board, and Curt was often by his side, helping out as an assistant at festival events.

One especially memorable moment came in 1959, when John F. Kennedy and Jacqueline Kennedy visited Chardon during the presidential campaign. Curt had the opportunity to meet them when his father presented the future president with a gallon of Geauga County's finest maple syrup.

For decades, Curt has remained deeply involved with the Burton Log Cabin and the Burton Chamber of Commerce. His contributions have ranged from syrup production to hands-on cabin maintenance, including roof repairs and water line work. Year after year, Curt – along with Tom Blair and many dedicated volunteers – has helped prepare for the annual sap run by cleaning equipment, canning syrup, making maple candy, and doing whatever else was needed.

In addition to his volunteer work, Curt served on the Burton Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors and held the role of President for several years, continuing a lifelong commitment to preserving Burton's maple sugaring traditions and community spirit.


